

ORDINANCE 82-13

To Amend Chapter 20.14 of the Bloomington Municipal Code Entitled "Minimum Off-Street Parking Requirements"

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. The following sections of Chapter 20.14 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, entitled "Minimum Off-Street Parking Requirements" be amended to read as follows:


20.14.01.04 Delete.

20.14.04.04. ENTRANCES. Wherever parking spaces flank an access drive to a public street, the parking spaces shall be separated from the drive by a raised island or other effective barrier.

20.14.04.05. GRADES. No part of any parking area, excluding drives that do not afford direct access to abutting parking spaces, shall have a slope of greater than 5%.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.




