## ORDINANCE 82-28

To Amend Section 20.04.01.00 of the Bloomington Municipal Code Concerning Definitions of "Amusement Machines", Section 20.14.02.00, Entitled "Table of Required Parking", and Section 20.14.03.02, Entitled "General Regulations"

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Section 20.04.01.00 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, entitled "Definitions' shall be amended to include the following;

"Amusement Machines" means any group of five or more machines or devices designed or modified to be operated by a coin, coin or tokens, or for the operation of which a charge is made for the purpose of providing amusement. Amusement machines include but are not limited to pinball machines, electronic games, pool tables, and coin operated movie booths. A machine or device used exclusively for the vending or merchandise of a tangible nature or laundry machines shall not be deemed amusement machines.

SECTION II. Section 20.14.02.00, entitled "Table of Required Parking", shall be amended to include the following use:

<u>Use</u>	Basic Spaces	Requirement <u>Per</u>
Amusement Machines (The larger of the following ratios shall be required.)		
Pool Tables	5.0	1000 sq. ft. gross floor area, or
	1.0	table
All others	8.0	1000 sq. ft. gross floor area, or
	2.0	3 machines

SECTION III. Section 20.14.03.02, under "General Regulations", shall be amended to read as follows:

20.14.03.02 Two or more buildings or uses may collectively provide the required off-street parking in which case the required number of parking spaces shall be not less than the sum of the requirements for the several individual uses computed separately. This provision shall apply to a business having space occupied by two or more uses.

SECTION IV. Severability. If any section of this ordinance or any part of any section shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions.

SECTION V. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
