

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, Z0-4-82, and recommended that the petitioner, Friedman and Shipley Builders, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from Residential Estate (RE) to Limited Business (BL) for property located at 5969 E. S.R. 46 more particularly described as follows:

A part of the Northeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 6, Township 8 North, Range 1 East, Monroe County, Indiana bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the Northeast corner of said quarter quarter in said Section 6, thence South 9 degrees 57 minutes East for a distance of 276.70 feet; thence North 74 degrees 31 minutes 34 seconds West for a distance of 190.15 feet; thence North 16 degrees 35 minutes 05 seconds East for a distance of 231.44 feet; thence East for a distance of 165.0 feet more or less and to the point of beginning. Containing in all 1.02 acres more or less;

also known as 5969 East State Road 46, Bloomington, Indiana.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
