ORDINANCE 82- 30

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from Single Dwelling Residential (RS) to Special Medical (SM) for property located at 1006 and 1012 West Second Street more particularly described as follows:

Lots five, six and seven in Weaver Addition to the City of Bloomington, being a part of Seminary lot 61, Section 5, Township 8 North, Range 1 W Monroe County Indiana

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
