#### SYNOPSIS

This ordinance approves budget transfers within the general funds. General Fund transfers are needed in the Fire Department budget to cover the final cost of installation of a new generator and in the Police Department budget for the purchase of portable radios and telephone dictating equipment. A transfer is needed in the Parks and Recreation Fund for year-end routine operating expenses and in the Parks and Recreation /Federal Revenue Sharing Fund budget to complete the installation of the Older American Center elevator.
