To Impose a Ninety-Day Moratorium on Collection  
Of Fees for On-Street Parking Meters


WHEREAS, the administration is considering the possibility of eliminating parking meters along city streets to stimulate the downtown; and

WHEREAS, a ninety-day trial period has been proposed to test the feasibility of the new policy;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

A ninety-day moratorium on the collection of fees for on-street parking meters shall be imposed as of the effective date of this resolution.



SYNOPSIS

As part of the administration's proposed changes in downtown parking, a ninety-day moratorium on collection of fees from on-street parking meters will be imposed on a trial basis.
