

ORDINANCE 81-14

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, Z0-64-80, and recommended that the petitioner, Rudy Group, Inc., be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RM to BL for property located at 621 North Indiana Avenue more particularly described as:

A part of Lot 18 in University Park Addition in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, as shown of record in Plat Book 2, page 25 and 26, in the Office of the Recorder of Monroe County, Indiana, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of said Lot 18; thence with the East line of said Lot 18 and running North for 77 feet; thence parallel with the South line of said Lot and running West for 50 feet and to the West line of said lot; thence with said West line and running South for 77 feet and to the southwest corner of said Lot 18; thence with the South line of said Lot and running East for 50 feet and to the point of beginning.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
