

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, Z0-8-81, and recommended that the petitioner, CLARA EDNA MARTINDALE, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RS (Residential Single Family) to BL (Limited Business) for property located at 1100 Weimer Road more particularly described as:

Part of the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 6 Township 8 North, Range 1 West, described as follows: Beginning on the one-half mile line running North and South through said section 6 at a point 904.5 feet North and 15 feet West of the one-half mile corner between Sections 6 and 7 in said township; Thence North 4 degrees West 70.5 feet to the right of way line of State Road #45; thence South 50 degrees West over and along said right of way of State Road #45 for a distance of 133 feet; thence South 5 degrees 30 minutes East for a distance of 60 feet, thence North 51 degrees and 30 minutes East for a distance of 120 feet and to the place of beginning. Containing in all 0.20 acres, more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
