To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WIEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-6-81 , and recommended that the petitioner, ROBERT MUSSELMAN , be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RS (Residential Single Family) to BA (Business Arterial) for property located at 225 and 231 South Adams Street more particularly described as:

A part of the Southwest quarter of Section 32, Township 9 North, Range 1 West, Monroe County, Indiana, described as follows: beginning at a point that is 811.57 feet West of the Southeast corner of said Southwest quarter; said point being the intersection of a creek and the centerline of Third Street; thence West on and along the centerline of said Third Street for 261.38 feet and to the East right of way of Adams Street; thence North 22 degrees 54 feet and 44 inches East on and along said East right of way for 276 07 feet and the centerline of active strengt of way for 276.07 feet and to the centerline of said creek; thence South 58 degrees 24 feet and 30 inches East on and along the centerline of said creek for 49.00 feet; thence South 26 degrees 08 feet East on and along the centerline of said creek for 254.65 feet and to the point of beginning. Containing in all 0.84 acres more or less. Subject to an existing right of way along the centerline of Third Street. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and SECTION II. after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
