

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-60-81, and recommended that the petitioner, Peoples State Bank be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY OBTAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from BA (Business Arterial) to MG (General Manufacturing) for property located at 1020 W 17th St. more particularly described as follows:

Parcel A: A part of the Southeast quarter of Section 29, Township 9 North, Range 1 West, Monroe County, Indiana bounded and described as follows: beginning at a point that is 429.00 feet East and 175.00 feet North of the Southwest corner of the said Southeast quarter, thence running South 89 degrees 56 minutes West for 267.00 feet parallel to the South line of the said Southeast quarter; thence running North for 163.15 feet; thence running North 89 degrees 56 minutes East parallel to said South line of quarter for 267.00 feet; thence running South for 163.15 feet and to the point of beginning. Containing in all 1.00 acres more or less.

Parcel B: A part of the Southeast quarter of Section 29, Township 9 North, Range 1 West, Monroe County, Indiana described as follows: Beginning at a point that is 429.00 feet East and 338.15 feet North of the Southwest corner of the said Southeast quarter; thence North for 697.27 feet; thence South 89 degrees 56 minutes West for 267.00; thence South for 697.27 feet; thence North 89 degrees 56 minutes East for 267.00 feet and to the point of beginning. Containing in all 4.28 acres more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
