

ORDINANCE 81-92

To Vacate Public Right-of-Way of West  
Ninth Street Located at 501 N. Rogers

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner, Transport Motor Express, has filed a petition to vacate the public right-of-way of West Ninth Street located at 501 N. Rogers; and

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-4-512 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, the public right-of-way shall be vacated that is located on West Ninth Street at 501 N. Rogers, more particularly described as follows:


That part of the platted right-of-way for West Ninth Street between N. Jackson and N. Rogers Streets. Said right-of-way being between Outlots #41 and #42 in Grahams Reserve, City of Bloomington, Indiana, and being 33' x 299'.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and published according to law.


