

ORDINANCE 81-94

To Amend the 1980 and 1981 Salary Ordinances for Utilities Employees to Add the Positions of Plant Service Mechanic and Chief Operator

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. From and after the day of October, 1981, the following classified positions, salaries and pay schedules for the Utilities Department be incorporated into Sections I and II of Ordinance 80-71, Salary Ordinance for the Utilities Department.

Section I. Treatment Operations

Chief Operator \$16,300
Plant Service Mechanic \$16,640

Section II. Pay Grade Classification Salary

21 Chief Operator \$14,980 - \$17,000
21 Plant Service Mechanic \$14,980 - \$17,000

SECTION II. From and after the day of October, 1981, the following classified positions, salary and pay schedule for the Utilities Department be incorporated into Sections I and II of Ordinance 81-77, Salary Ordinance for the Utilities Department.

Section I. Treatment Operations

Chief Operator \$17,500
Plant Service Mechanic \$17,992

Section II. Pay Grade Classification Salary

21 Chief Operator \$16,250 - \$17,992
21 Plant Service Mechanic \$16,250 - \$17,992

SECTION III. The rates shown as wages and salaries for the positions listed above are the maximum rates.

SECTION IV. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
