## RESOLUTION 81-6

<u>To Authorize the City of Bloomington to Acquire Land by</u> <u>Condemnation for the Expansion of Bloomington Hospital</u>

- WHEREAS, IC 16-12-22 authorizes the City of Bloomington to acquire land by condemnation when such land is necessary for the expansion of a non-profit hospital corporation; and
- WHEREAS, the Local Council of Women of Bloomington, Indiana, Inc. (Bloomington Hospital) has been unable to acquire all the land necessary for the presently contemplated expansion of Bloomington Hospital; and
- WHEREAS, the Local Council of Women of Bloomington, Indiana, Inc. has requested the City pursuant to IC 16-12-22 to use its power of eminent domain to acquire land necessary for the presently contemplated expansion;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. The City of Bloomington, specifically the City Attorney, is hereby authorized to acquire by condemnation the following described land necessary for the expansion of Bloomington Hospital, to-wit:

> Lot Number 6 in St. Clair's sub-division of Seminary Lots 37 and 46 in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, as shown by the recorded plat thereof.

Also part of Lot Number 5 in St. Clair's Sub-division of Seminary Lots 37 and 46 in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, bounded and described as follows, to wit: Commencing at the Southeast corner of said Lot 5 and running thence West 50 feet, running thence North  $10\frac{1}{2}$  feet, running thence Southeasterly along the railroad track to the place of beginning.

SECTION II. All costs, direct or indirect, of said condemnation shall be borne by the Bloomington Hospital.

All costs will be paid by the Hospital.

Bloomington Hospital is expanding and has been unable to buy all of the land it needs. State law allows the City to use its right of eminent domain for the Hospital. The Local Council of Women has requested the

City to do this, and this resolution allows the City to take such action.
