

ORDINANCE 79-18

To Amend Title 6 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, Entitled, "Health and Sanitation" to Substitute the Title of "General Superintendent of the Department of Public Works" for the Titles of "Sexton of Rosehill Cemetery" and "Director of Sanitation"

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Chapter 6.04 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, entitled "Refuse Collection by the City of Bloomington", shall be amended as follows:

The title of "General Superintendent of the Department of Public Works" shall be substituted where the title "Director of Sanitation" appears in Sections 6.04.040 (b) and (c), 6.04.050(d), and 6.04.060.

SECTION II. Chapter 6.08 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, entitled "Cemeteries and Burials", shall be amended as follows:

The title of "General Superintendent of the Department of Public Works" shall be substituted where the title of "Sexton of Rosehill Cemetery" appears in Sections 6.08.010(6) and (8), 6.08.020 and 6.08.030.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
