## ORDINANCE 79-64

## To Amend 1980 Salary Ordinance to Reclassify the Position of Assistant to Deputy City Engineer

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. That from and after the first day of January, 1980, the salary and pay schedule of the following employee of the City of Bloomington, be fixed as follows:

I, the undersigned, Francis X. SYNOPSIS

This ordinance amends the 1980 salary ordinance passed July 31, 1979 by reclassifying the position of Assistant City Engineer to Deputy City Engineer and increasing the salary from \$17,462 to \$18,532. This represents a seven percent increase over the amended 1979 salary of \$17,320 proposed in 79-63.
