

ORDINANCE 79-78

AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING APPROPRIATIONS WITHIN THE GENERAL, FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING, PARKING METER FUNDS OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.
