Unless a department has a full-fledged instruction program as in the Police and Fire Departments, instruction is accomplished through travel to seminars and conferences. Therefore, most departments budget instruction costs in line 21, travel.

The Engineering Department will send two Housing Inspectors to a local IVY Tech course this fall; therefore, a part of the money they have budgeted for instruction must be transferred to line 23, instruction.

The Planning Department has found it difficult to keep up with the rising cost of gasoline and must transfer for that expense. Also, their necessary long distrance budget was under-anticipated and must be supplemented by a transfer.


