

RESOLUTION NO. 79-32

Resolution Authorizing the Filing of
an Application for a Grant Under
Section 18 of the Urban Mass Trans-
portation Act of 1964, as Amended.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation is authorized to make grants to states through the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to support capital and operating assistance projects for nonurbanized public transportation systems under Section 18 of the UMT Act of 1964, as amended;

WHEREAS, the Division of Public Transportation, State Planning Services Agency (SPSA) has been designated by the Governor to make Section 18 grants for public transportation projects; and

WHEREAS, the contract for financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon the applicant, including the provision by it of the local share of project costs; and

WHEREAS, it is required by the U.S. Department of Transportation in accord with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as Amended, the applicant give an assurance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the U.S. Department of Transportation requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the Applicant that minority business enterprise be utilized to the fullest extent possible in connection with this project and that definitive procedures shall be established and administered to ensure that minority business shall have the maximum feasible opportunity to compete for contracts when procuring construction contracts, supplies, equipment contracts, or consultant and other services:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA:

1. That the Mayor is authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of the City of Bloomington with the SPSA to aid in the financing of capital or operating assistance projects pursuant to Section 18 of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.

2. That the Mayor is authorized to execute and file such applications and assurance or any other document required by the U.S. Department of Transportation effectuating the purposes of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

3. That Betsy Williams, Deputy Controller/Grantsperson, is authorized to furnish such additional information as SPSA may require in connection with the application or the project.

4. That the Deputy Controller/Grantsperson is authorized to set forth and execute affirmative minority business policies in connection with the project's procurement needs.

5. That the Mayor is authorized to execute grant contract agreements on behalf of the City of Bloomington with SPSA for aid in the financing of the capital or operating assistance projects.

SYNOPSIS

Resolution No. 79-32

This resolution authorizes the Mayor to execute and file an application and required assurances with the Indiana State Planning Services Agency on behalf of the City of Bloomington. The purpose of this application is to apply for federal aid in the financing of operating costs for Bloomington Transit. Currently, BT is funded largely by Federal Revenue Sharing monies. If approved, this federal subsidy will free Revenue Sharing funds for other purposes. Approximately \$200,000 is being requested from SPSA for the current fiscal year.
