

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 79-2

To Specially Appropriate From the General Fund Expenditures Not

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. For the expenses of said municipal corporation the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the several funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing same:

LEGAL NOTICE ORDINANCE 79-8 To Fix the Annual Salaries of All Elected City Officials BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT: SECTION I. The annual salaries of elected officials of the City of Bloomington for the term beginning January 1, 1980 and extending through December 31, 1983 shall be: Mayor \$30,000 City Clerk \$12,500 Council members \$4,000 SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor. Tomilea Allison, President Bloomington Common Council SYNOPSIS IC 12-2-10 requires that the common council of each city, by ordinance duly enacted on or before the first day of April of the year in which elections of city officers are held, fix the annual salaries of all elected city officials. The salaries may then not be changed by the common council during the respective terms of their offices. State law also requires the ordinance to be published twice prior to the date of final passage, with the first publication not less than thirty days prior to the date of final passage of the ordinance.
