

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 79- 15

AN ORDINANCE SPECIALLY APPROPRIATING FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget; now, therefore,

SECTION I. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, of Monroe County, Indiana that for the expenses of said municipal corporation the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the several funds herein named for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same:
