ORDINANCE 78-16

To Amend Section 2.64.010 of the Bloomington Municipal Code and Set Mileage Rate Paid to City Employees

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Common Council of the City of Bloomington to set the mileage rate paid to City employees; and

WHEREAS, it has been the policy of the City to follow the rate paid by the State of Indiana to its employees; and

WHEREAS, by following that policy, the City has for several years paid at the rate of 15¢ per mile;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Section 2.64.010 of the Bloomington Municipal Code shall be amended to read as follows:

2.64.010 Mileage Allowance. In all instances where city employees use their own vehicles in city affairs and work, other than traveling from their home to their place of work and from their place of work to their home, such employee shall be entitled to an allowance of fifteen cents per mile for each mile actually traveled.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

SYNOPSIS

Examiners from the State Board of Accounts have called to the attention of the Controller the fact that the City does not have a current ordinance setting the mileage rate as is advised by the State Board. Employees driving out of town on City business or from their offices to another location within the City on City business may be reimbursed by the City. The City had paid 12ϕ per mile for several years; this ordinance would make future payments of that rate official.
