

ORDINANCE 78- 77

AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING APPROPRIATIONS WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND AND PARKING METER FUND OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.





SYNOPSIS

Ordinance 78- 77

This ordinance transfers budget allowances in the operation and maintenance budgets of Board of Works, Fire, and Parking Meter-Police. If passed, it will provide for certain operation and maintenance as well as capital needs within those budgets without necessitating special appropriations.
