

ORDINANCE 77-47

AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING APPROPRIATIONS WITHIN DEPARTMENTS IN THE GENERAL FUND OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, that the City Controller may adjust the appropriations of the following budgets, to wit:

SYNOPSIS

ORDINANCE 77-47

An Ordinance Transferring Appropriations within Departments in the General Fund of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana.

This transfer ordinance settles some financial problems for three City departments without resorting to special appropriations.

Purchase of a new bookkeeping machine in the Controller's Office brought some unanticipated expenses in Contractual Services. The maintenance contract on the machine was \$343.50 greater than the contract quoted for the old machine, and an expensive electrical rewiring was made. Also, the State Board of Accounts demanded a separate column in the City's paychecks for the County Option Tax which necessitated a \$300.00 programming bill.

The Environmental Commission purchased a tape recorder thinking it was an appropriate expenditure from Supplies.

Sanitation has suffered an unusual number of truck breakdowns.
