

RESOLUTION 77-20  
INTERDEPARTMENTAL FUNDING AGREEMENT

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. The Civil City of Bloomington, Indiana hereby agrees that the following amounts are sufficient compensation from the Utilities Service Board to the City for taxes that would be paid on utility property were it privately owned.

SECTION II. The Utilities Service Board has agreed to pay the City the following amounts, including salaries and fringe benefits and the City agrees to accept same:

## SYNOPSIS

### Resolution 77-20

#### Interdepartmental Funding Agreement

The Utilities Service Board is authorized by IC 8-1-2-96 to pay sums sufficient to compensate the City for the taxes that would be paid on utility property were it privately owned. This resolution sets out the funding arrangement between the City and the Board that was agreed upon by a committee composed of members from the Council, the Mayor's Office and the Utilities Service Board. The total amount that the Utilities Department will be paying is \$305,701, which is an increase of 5% over 1977's total, and the number of positions remains the same (30) although some titles have changed.
