## APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 77-17

AN ORDINANCE SPECIALLY APPROPRIATING FROM THE FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING TRUST FUND EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget; now, therefore:

SECTION I. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington of Monroe County, Indiana that for the expenses of said municipal corporation the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the several funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same:

## SYNOPSIS

## Appropriation Ordinance 77-17

Under state law, no money can be spent by the City without authorization from the Council in the form of an appropriation ordinance.

This appropriation handles four separate matters.

The Board of Works receives Revenue Sharing to make the lease payments on the Park & Shop lot to the end of 1977. In 1978, Parking Meter revenues will be appropriated to that purpose.

An interim emergency housing program will be run by Perry Township Trustee Joel Grogan by contract with the City and County.

The City and County likewise are to combine efforts to help support the Youth Shelter program which will be funded primarily through a Criminal Justice grant.

Finally, the Parks and Recreation department has a rare opportunity to replace a badly deteriorated boat ramp at Lake Lemon. The Bass Masters Association has offered to donate the largest portion of the money for the project to the City, and the City will contribute just under \$5,000. This project was included in the Capital Improvements budget for a great deal more money.
