## ORDINANCE 76-6

## AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA FOR THE YEAR 1976

## SYNOPSIS OF ORDINANCE 76-6

Ordinance 76-6 represents correction of a clerical error made in preparation of the salary ordinance for 1976. The 1976 wage rate for heavy equipment operators was incorrectly entered as \$4.79/hour, the 1975 rate. The \$5.18/hour rate requested is the intended 1976 maximum for the position, representing 4% increases in January and July of 1976.
