

ORDINANCE NO. 76-9

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE ANNEXATION OF  
ADJACENT AND CONTIGUOUS TERRITORY

WHEREAS, the Boundary of the City of Bloomington, Indiana,  
is adjacent to the real estate described herein,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF  
THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the following described land be, and the  
same is, hereby annexed to and declared a part of the City of  
Bloomington, Indiana, to-wit:

A part of the Southeast Quarter of Section 10,  
Township 8 North, Range 1 West in Monroe  
County, Indiana, more particularly described  
as follows: Beginning on the East line of the  
said Quarter Section, South 00 degrees 06  
minutes 30 seconds West 1528.00 feet from  
the Northeast corner of the said quarter section  
(the said place of beginning is the Southeast  
corner of "Spicewood Addition-Section Three",  
the plat of which is recorded March 12, 1975,  
in Plat Book 6, page 71 and 71A in the Office  
of the Recorder of Monroe County, Indiana):  
thence South 00 degrees 06 minutes 30 seconds  
West along the said East line 446.60 feet to a  
point witness by a six (6) inch square cut  
stone bearing North 89 degrees 11 minutes 16  
seconds West, 4.54 feet and a six (6) inch  
square cut stone bearing North 89 degrees 11  
minutes 16 seconds West 2605.10 feet; thence  
North 89 degrees 11 minutes 16 seconds West  
385.01 feet; thence North 00 degrees 48 minutes  
44 seconds East 107.39 feet; thence North 41  
degrees 23 minutes 24 seconds East 93.54 feet;  
thence North 00 degrees 06 minutes 30 seconds  
East 241.61 feet to the Southeast corner of  
Lot 61 in the said "Spicewood Addition-Section  
Three", (the next four (4) courses are along  
the Southerly bounds of the said "Spicewood  
Addition-Section Three"); thence North 00  
degrees 48 minutes 44 seconds East 28.39 feet;  
thence South 89 degrees 53 minutes 30 seconds  
East 131.61 feet; thence South 00 degrees 06  
minutes 30 seconds West 5.81 feet; thence  
south 89 degrees 53 minutes 30 seconds East  
190.00 feet to the place of beginning, contain-  
ing 3.508 acres, more or less.

The above described real esatte is known as  
Spicewood Fourth Addition.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained, that the boundaries  
of the City of Bloomington shall be, and the same are, hereby  
delcared to be extended so as to include all of the real estate  
hereinabove described as a part of the City of Bloomington, Indiana.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, promulgation, approval by the Mayor and publication in accordance with the law.


