

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE SIGN LAWS REGARDING TEMPORARY BANNERS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION 1. Section 12.12.010 be amended to read: With the exception of "Temporary Banners" permitted by Section 12.12.060, the following signs or devices are illegal and in violation of this chapter:

(1) Any sign or device attached to a structure located on private property, which project into, over or upon the public right-of-way as platted or established by prescription for a distance in excess of twelve inches;

(2) Any sign or device attached to a structure, pole, or other device standing in or upon the public right-of-way as platted or established by prescription.

SECTION 2. That the following sections be added:

12.12.060 Temporary Banners. The Bloomington Board of Public Works shall have the authority to grant temporary permits for the erection of banners over the public right-of-way.

12.12.061 Temporary permits may be granted only to advertise events sponsored by organizations or groups engaged in not-for-profit, service-oriented activities.

12.16.062 No permit may be issued for a period longer than fifteen [15] days, with optional renewal of fifteen [15] days to be considered for each request.

12.16.063 No banner may be erected in a manner which will interfere with the health, safety, or welfare of the general public.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

ORDINANCE 76-16

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE SIGN LAWS REGARDING TEMPORARY BANNERS

The Bloomington Municipal code currently makes it illegal to post banners over the public streets. On a number of occasions not-for-profit, service oriented groups have requested that they be allowed to put up such banners to advertise their activities. This Ordinance would allow those groups to apply to the City Board of Public Works for a permit to hang their banners for fifteen days.
