

AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING APPROPRIATIONS WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND AND THE FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING TRUST FUND OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, that the City Controller may adjust the appropriations of the following budgets, to wit:


SECTION II. THIS ORDINANCE shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and its approval by the Mayor.



SYNOPSIS

ORDINANCE 76-77

An Ordinance transferring Appropriations within the General Fund and Federal Revenue Sharing Fund

When money is budgeted for use by the City Departments, it is broken into "line items", such as services personal, equipment, etc. State law requires that money from one line item cannot be used for something covered by another line item without a budget transfer by action of the Common Council.

The Animal Shelter requests a budget transfer of \$400. Due to vandalism, they must pay the first \$250 for repairs, the remainder to be paid by insurance. The balance of \$150 will be used to repair a vehicle damaged in an accident.


The City Clerk's office requests a budget transfer of \$100 from Office Supplies to Communication & Transportation. This money is needed to cover expenses in telephone and postage.

The City Court requests a budget transfer of \$71 from salaries & wages, temporary to create a new line item, other contractual services. The City Judge would like to pick up a towing and storage charge incurred during a small claims court case.

The Engineering Department requests a budget transfer of \$700 from salaries and wages, regular to several line items, including: repairs, other contractual services, office supplies, and other office supplies. This transfer is needed due to staff revision and will cover expenses for the remainder of the year.

The Transit Department requests a budget transfer of \$13,300 of Federal Revenue Sharing monies from salaries and retirement, and social security, to garage and motor (\$2,800) and repair parts (\$10,500) line items. Due to encumbering funds from 1975, and less money paid in salaries than anticipated, this amount may be used to pay for necessary repairs and supplies which have increased due to inflation.
