- WHEREAS, despite the relative affluence of our society, numerous people in the United States face severe malnutrition or increasingly inadequate diets; and
- WHEREAS, as citizens of the United States and concerned human beings we should extend all efforts to alleviate the tragedy; and
- WHEREAS, World Hunger will not be overcome without concerted human, spiritual, and political action; and
- WHEREAS, many citizens of Bloomington are working toward such action;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, that

SECTION I. April 8, 1976 Be Declared World Food Day.

SECTION II. All citizens are urged to attend films and panel discussions from April 4-8 at the Indiana University Memorial Union and other locations.
