Synopsis of Resolution 76- 17

Inadequacies in the Fire Department budget were discovered and corrected in Appropriation Ordinance 76-2.

However, that Ordinance still has not been approved by the State Board of Tax Commissioners, and the Fire Department has a number of bills and unhappy creditors.

Chief Gose requests a departmental transfer of funds to cover those bills. He believes that he can cover the outstanding bills with money originally appropriated for salaries because all fire positions were not filled on January 1st. If, however, this proves too great a burden on the salary account toward the end of the year, he will request a re-transfer.
