SYNOPSIS

RESOLUTION 76-32

Budget Transfer

When money is budgeted for use by the City departments, it is broken into line items, such as services personal, equipment, etc. State law requires that money from one item cannot be used for something covered by another item without a budget transfer of the Common Council.

This resolution transfers \$4,000 in the Sanitation Department budget from Other Garage and Motor Supplies to Motor Equipment, so that they will be able to replace an old and failing dump truck by transfer. The amount of the transfer is based on four unofficial bids received by the department head.

The Sanitation Department is requesting a budget transfer of \$4,000 into Motor Equipment for the purchase of a one-half ton pick-up truck (Resolution 76-31). Members of the Council Utilities/Public Facilities Committee have requested a policy statement from the Board on the use of this truck.

The Sanitation Department pick-up truck is used to bring tools and spare tires to the garbage trucks that have broken down en-route or at the land-fill; to pick up trash missed by the regular service and to haul large items during special clean-up; and to provide transportation for substitute employees at hours when other transportation is not available. In accordance with Mayor McCloskey's policy on City-owned vehicles, this pick-up truck is for uses related to the Sanitation Service only and is left at the Sanitation Garage at other times.
