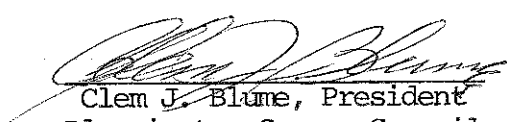

SYNOPSIS

Resolution 76-32

Regarding the Reprogramming of Funds in the Community Development
Program Budget and the Community Development Budget

Under state law, the Redevelopment Commission, City of Bloomington, is empowered with the operation of programs for the elimination of slum and blighting conditions. Through Community Development Block Grant Number B-HN-75-0002 a number of programs have been funded in accordance with the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. For those programs two related budgets have been established, the Community Development Budget and the Community Development Line Item Budget.

In order to provide for the installation of lateral sewer lines in conjunction with the Miller Drive Sewer Project Phase One, the Redevelopment Commission has reprogrammed funds from "Contingencies" to the proper program and line item in the identified budgets.

Although not required by state law or federal guidelines, the Redevelopment Commission has submitted the resolution to the Common Council for it to have official notice of the reprogramming and to concur in the Commission's recommendations.

The Work Release Center has an immediate requirement for operating funds. It cannot remain open until August or September until the money is received from the Indiana Criminal Justice Planning Agency.
 Currently persons in the center numbering 15 will be returned into the prison system.
 It will require approximately \$5,500 to maintain this center for a short period of time. The request has been made for the Common Council and Mayor to seek adequate funds for an immediate solution to the problem in support of this functioning agency.

 To Line 2 Public Works, Facilities, Site Improvements
