

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 76 - 4

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AN ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE BUDGETS FOR 1976, FOR THE WATER AND WASTEWATER UTILITY DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That there be and hereby is appropriated from the Water Utility Fund for said City for the year 1976 the following sums in addition to that provided by APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 75-14.



APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 76-4

Adjustments to 1976 Utilities Budget

Under State and City law, the Common Council is charged with the duty to oversee the budget of the Utilities Department, even though that department is also responsible to the Utilities Service Board. The Council therefore must appropriate money before it can be spent by the Utilities.

The monies covered by this Ordinance were not part of the Utilities Budget passed at the last meeting in December and so must be appropriated by the Council if they are to be spent. The \$39,747.61 appropriated was made necessary to replenish the funds authorized by Resolution 76-6, that were given to the City for the benefits paid on the franchise fees.
