## APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 76- /2

## AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM THE PARKING METER FUND

Under state law, no money can be spent by the City without authorization from the Council in the form of an appropriation ordiance. Since the monies covered by this ordiannce were not part of the budget for 1976 passed last August, they must now be approved by the Council if they are to be spent.

This money is needed to replace parking meter heads in the lot at 4th and Washington Streets. A recent Council ordinance changed the fees in that lot from a 12-hour to a 2-hour basis.

A check of parking meter revenues this year indicates that this amount should be available above the regular parking meter budget.
