AN ORDINANCE SPECIALLY APPROPRIATING FROM THE GENERAL FUND AND FROM FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED FROM THOSE FUNDS OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget or to re-appropriate monies already appropriated in other funds in the annual budget; now, therefore:

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington of Monroe County, Indiana that for the expenses of said municipal corporation the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the several funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same.

SYNOPSIS

appropriation ordinance 76-15

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM THE GENERAL FUND AND FROM FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING TO PARKS AND RECREATION

Under state law, no money can be spent by the City without authorization from the Council in the form of an appropriation ordinance. Since the monies covered by this ordinance were not part of the budget for 1976 passed last August, they must now be approved by the Council if they are to be spent.

When the budget was prepared last summer, an error was made in the preparation of the 12-line statement which resulted in a \$100,000 deficit in Parks and Recreation funds for 1976. This means that while the Parks and Recreation Department has full authorization from local and state authorities to spend \$639,919.25 as budgeted, it will receive in taxes and revenues only \$524,500.00. A further problem—an unexpected debt of sales tax—brings the total deficit to \$122,741.25.

If the City choses not to cut Parks and Recreation programs to a serious extent, as previously agreed informally, it must make up that deficit from other funds. The Controller and the Mayor suggest using the following funds: the balance of the Parking Meter fund as of December 31, 1975, the balance of a parking bond sinking fund, now defunct, and revenue sharing.

The parking meter and parking bond funds must enter the general fund rather than the Parks & Recreation fund. This ordinance, then, is the reappropriation of line items previously budgeted in Parks and Recreation into General Fund and Federal Revenue Sharing.

The amount appropriated to the Board of Works is in effect a reimbursement from Parks and Recreation to the Board of Works for two quarters of Parks and Recreation's gross tax which was picked up by the Board of Works.
