SYNOPSIS

Appropriation Ordinance 76-18

An Ordinance to Appropriate Funds from the Cumulative Capital Fund

Under state law, no money can be spent by the City without authorization from the Council in the form of an appropriation ordinance. Since the monies covered by this ordinance were not part of the budget for 1976, they must now be approved by the Council if they are to be spent.

State law provides that the Cumulative Capital Improvement Fund, which comes from cigarette taxes, shall be used solely for capital improvements. Therefore the Parks and Recreation Department is requesting an appropriation from that fund to replace the dressing rooms and toilet facilities at the beach area at Lake Lemon where the present facilities will not pass health standards nor the building code.

Work will be performed by the Parks and Recreation maintenance crews with the exception of the plumbing which will be contracted out.
