

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 76-20

To Appropriate Funds from Cumulative Capital Fund and
from Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to Fire Department

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA THAT:

SECTION I. For the expenses of said municipal corporation the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the several funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same:

SYNOPSIS

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 76-20

Under state law, no money can be spent by the City without authorization from the Council in the form of an appropriation ordinance.

The ordinance authorizes \$8,600 from Cumulative Capital Improvement Fund to do minimal repairs to the Old Library Building and keep it from further deterioration, and \$2,500 from General Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to the Fire Department to change all Fire Department radios to a new frequency.

For some time the Bloomington Fire Department has shared a radio frequency with the Indianapolis school busses. In the last few months, this situation has become intolerable, making it impossible for the City's ambulances and fire equipment to communicate early in the morning or late in the afternoon.

This change must receive FCC clearance, but if the appropriation procedure is begun now, the money will be available as soon as approval is received and work can begin immediately.
