## APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 76-23

An Ordinance to Appropriate Funds from the Parks and Recreation Fund and the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund

## SYNOPSIS

## Appropriation Ordinance 76-23

An Ordinance to Appropriate Funds from the Parks and Recreation Fund and the Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund

Under state law, no money can be spent by the City without authority from the Council in the form of an appropriation ordinance. Since the monies covered by this ordinance were not part of the budget for 1976, they must now be approved by the Council if they are to be spent.

The fund balances of the Parks & Recreation Department are at last in order due to transfers of \$120,000 from other funds to Parks and Recreation's use and a payment from the County of \$30,000. The Tax Board, then, will now allow necessary appropriation for the 27th payroll in that department.

The Controller's Office proposes using the interest earned in the Federal Revenue Sharing fund to make a first year's lease-purchase payment on a new bookkeeping machine.
