An Ordinance Fixing the Salaries of Appointed Officers and Employees of the City of Bloomington, Indiana for the Year 1975

ORDINANCE 75-11

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION I. That from and after the first day of January, 1975, the salary and pay schedule for the following appointed officers and employees of the City of Bloomington, be fixed as follows:

SALARY SCHEDULE AS PRESENTED BY MAYOR FRANCIS X. Mc CLOSKEY MARCH 6, 1975

TO THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

I, the undersigned, Francis X. Mc Closkey, Mayor of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, as required by Chapter 107 of the Acts of 1959, hereby fix the salaries and pay schedule for the following appointed officers and employees of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, beginning March 1, 1975, and continuing thereafter until duly changed, and request that such salary rates be approved by the Common Council of said City, to-wit:

DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES

SPECIAL PROJECTS STAFF.....\$8,000 a Year.

SECTION II. Salaries paid under this Ordinance shall not be dispersed until the Common Council has approved by Resolution, the specific projects.

SECTION III. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor.
