

ORDINANCE NO. 74-74

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE ANNEXATION
OF ADJACENT AND CONTIGUOUS TERRITORY

WHEREAS, the Boundary of the City of Bloomington, Indiana,
is adjacent to the real estate described herein,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the following described land be, and the
same is, hereby annexed to and declared a part of the City of
Bloomington, Indiana, to-wit:


A part of Seminary Lot 135 of the City of
Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, bounded
and described as follows, to-wit: Beginning
at the Southeast corner of said Seminary Lot
135; thence running West 557.00 feet; thence
North 620.5 feet; thence East 557.00 feet;
thence South 620.5 feet and to the place of
beginning, containing 7.43 acres, more or less.

The above description describes a tract of
land lying at the Northwest corner of Hillside
Drive and High Street commonly known as Stier
Park.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained, that the boundaries
of the City of Bloomington shall be, and the same are, hereby
declared to be extended so as to include all of the real estate
hereinabove described as a part of the City of Bloomington, Indiana.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect
from and after its passage, promulgation, approval by the Mayor
and publication in accordance with the law.


