

ORDINANCE NO. 74-96

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE ANNEXATION OF
ADJACENT AND CONTIGUOUS TERRITORY

WHEREAS, the Boundary of the City of Bloomington, Indiana,
is adjacent to the real estate described herein,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the following described land be, and the
same is, hereby annexed to and declared a part of the City of
Bloomington, Indiana, to-wit:

A part of the Southwest quarter of Section 28,
Township 9 North, Range 1 West, Monroe County,
Indiana, described as follows: Beginning at the
intersection of the East right-of-way of Kinser
Pike and the South right-of-way of 17th Street,
running thence North along the East right-of-
way of Kinser Pike a distance of 1570 feet, more
or less and to the point where a Spring Branch
crosses the said East right-of-way line of
Kinser Pike; thence Northeasterly with said
spring Branch a distance of 1287.0 feet, more
or less, to the West right-of-way line of the
Old Dixie Highway (Old State Road #37); thence
North along said West right-of-way to its inter-
section with the South right-of-way of State
Highway #46 By-Pass; running thence East along
said right-of-way to its intersection with the
West right-of-way of State Highway #37; running
thence South along said West right-of-way to its
intersection with the South right-of-way of 17th
Street; running thence West along said South
right-of-way to the point of beginning; EXCEPTING
from the above description the following tracts:
Those lands annexed by Ordinance No. 64-28
(North Plaza); and those lands annexed by
Ordinance No. 73-37 (Peoples State Bank).

The above description describes those lands lying
between Kinser Pike and State Road #37, North
of 17th Street, and South of Ramada Inn Motel.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained, that the boundaries
of the City of Bloomington shall be, and the same are, hereby
declared to be extended so as to include all of the real estate
hereinabove described as a part of the City of Bloomington,
Indiana.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and
effect from and after its passage, promulgation, approval by the
Mayor and publication in accordance with the law.


