

ORDINANCE NO. 74- 102

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 15.72 OF THE
BLOOMINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE, SECTION 15.72.040
ENTITLED, "PARKING METERS"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That Section 15.72.040 of the Bloomington
Municipal Code be amended by adding to the words, "College Avenue,
Third Street to Eighth Street, the following words:

"except the first parking space in the 100
block of South College Avenue on the West
Side of the Street which shall be designated
as a loading zone."

SECTION 2. That Section 15.72.040 of the Bloomington
Municipal Code be amended by adding to the words, "Sixth Street,
Morton Street to Lincoln Street" the following words:

"except the first two parking spaces west of
the alley on the South side of the 200 block of
West Sixth Street which shall be designated as
a loading zone."

SECTION 3. That Section 15.72.040 of the Bloomington
Municipal Code be amended by adding to the words, "Seventh
Street, Morton Street to Washington Street", the following words:

"except the South side of the 200 block of West
Seventh Street from College Avenue to the first
alley running north and south which shall be
designated as a no parking zone."

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and
effect from and after its passage, promulgation and publication
in accordance with the law.


