

ORDINANCE No. 73-65

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE BLOOMINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLE 15, Chapter 15.64, "Parking," Chapter 15.68, "Parking Lots," and Chapter 15.72, "Parking Meters".

WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington has agreed in a memorandum of understanding to certain changes in the downtown parking arrangement; and

WHEREAS, in order to give those changes full and lawful effect, certain amendments to the City ordinances governing on and off-street parking are necessary,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, THAT THE BLOOMINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

Chapter 15.64

PARKING

Section 15.64.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.64.010 Two-hour parking zones--Penalty for violation--Subsequent offenses.

The registered owner or operator of any motor vehicle, parked in the areas described in Section 15.64.030, for a period in excess of two hours in any given parking meter space on any given date shall be fined in the sum of two dollars, in the event there are no other outstanding and unsatisfied violations.

In the event there are other outstanding violations, whether for over-time parking or for parking beyond the legal period established for any parking zone, the registered owner shall pay to the City the sum of five dollars for the first such outstanding and unsatisfied violation, and the sum of ten dollars for each additional outstanding and unsatisfied violation.

Section 15.64.020 is hereby deleted.

Section 15.64.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.64.040 Two-hour parking zones--Applicability of Section 15.64.010.
Section 15.64.010 shall not be applicable to those areas where parking meters are located, except on the Public Square, one block off the Square in each direction, and on Washington Street between Seventh and Fourth.

Section 15.64.360 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.64.360 Time limit on certain streets.

When signs are erected in each block giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle for a longer time than stated between the hours of nine a.m. and six p.m. of any day except Sundays and public holidays, provided, however, that such provision against so parking shall, on Fridays, be between the hours of nine a.m. and nine p.m.

Chapter 15.68

PARKING LOTS

Sections 15.68.010 through 15.68.100 inclusive pertaining to "Central Parking Lot" are hereby deleted.

Section 15.68.120 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.68.120 (a) The municipal parking lot located at the Northwest Corner of East Fourth and Dunn Streets shall be named and referred to as Municipal Parking Lot Number One; and subparagraph (a) shall become subparagraph (b), subparagraph (b) shall become subparagraph (c), subparagraph (c) shall become subparagraph (d), subparagraph (d) shall become subparagraph (e), subparagraph (e) shall become subparagraph (f).

Section 15.68.130 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.68.130 Hourly Charge.

(a) The charge for the use of Municipal Parking Lots No. 1, No. 2, No. 3, No. 4, and No. 5 shall be five cents per thirty minute period or part thereof and ten cents per sixty minute period for the use of each space, excepting those otherwise designated by signs, between the hours of nine a.m. and six p.m. of any day except Sundays and public holidays, provided, however, that such charge shall apply on Fridays between the hours of nine a.m. and nine p.m.

The charge of five cents per thirty/minute period or part thereof and ten cents per sixty minute period for the use of each space shall be collected by parking meters installed thereon, and any person parking a motor vehicle thereon shall deposit coins of the United States at such rates.

(b) In thirteen spaces on Municipal Lot No. 6, when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle for a period of time longer than thirty minutes between the hours of eight a.m. and five p.m. In all other spaces, except those otherwise designated, no

person shall park a vehicle for a period of time longer than sixty minutes between the hours of eight a.m. and five p.m.

Section 15.68.210 is amended to read as follows:

15.68.210 Notice of violation--Fee payment.

Police Department personnel shall attach to vehicles violating the provisions of this chapter, a notice to the owner or operator thereof that such vehicle has been parked in violation of the provisions of this chapter, instructing such owner or operator to report to the parking violation division of the Police Department of the City in regard to such violation.

In the event there are no other outstanding and unsatisfied violations, such owner or operator shall pay to the traffic division of the City, in full satisfaction of such violation the sum of two dollars.

In the event there are other outstanding and unsatisfied violations, such owner or operator shall pay to the traffic division of the City the sum of five dollars for the first such outstanding and unsatisfied violation and the sum of ten dollars for each additional outstanding and unsatisfied violation. (ord. 68-49 1, 1968: prior code 17-159).

Section 15.68.220 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.68.220 Disposition of receipts.

The City Controller shall deposit to the credit of the City and in the appropriate special fund all monies received as payment for parking privileges or for violation of any provision of this chapter.

Section 15.68.230 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.68.230 Penalty for violation of chapter.

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this chapter or any person who aids, abets, or assists therein shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of any amount not exceeding fifty dollars for each offense or violation.

The following section shall be added to this chapter:

15.68.240 Parking Lots leased by the City.

Each and every parking lot leased by and under the control of the City and upon which meters have been properly placed and calibrated shall be subject to the provisions of this chapter in the same manner as if such lot were owned outright by the City.

Chapter 15.72

PARKING METERS

Section 15.72.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.72.050 Deposit of coins--hourly charge.

Whenever a vehicle is parked in a separate parking space where a parking meter has been installed, the person parking such vehicle shall deposit coins of the United States, if such meter displays the signal showing that legal parking is only permitted on such deposit. The charge for parking shall be five cents per thirty/minute period or part thereof and ten cents per sixty minute period for the use of each space. Notice to the public shall be given by appropriate signs setting forth the length of time for which parking is permitted and the conditions thereof. These may be upon the parking meter stand or in the immediate vicinity. Any vehicle which remains in a separate parking space after the time has elapsed for which the privilege of parking in such space has been paid is hereby determined to be illegally parked.

Section 15.72.080 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.72.080 Times when provisions applicable.

The provisions of this chapter including hourly charges shall apply to vehicles parked or standing upon the streets of the City in the congested areas hereinbefore described between the hours of nine a.m. and six p.m. of any day except Sundays and public holidays, provided, however, that such provisions shall apply on Friday's between the hours of nine a.m. and nine p.m.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, promulgation, and publication in accordance with the law.
