AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF UTILITY EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, FOR THE YEAR 1974

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

Employees working on the evening or night shift shall receive a ten cent per hour shift premium. Employees working on a swing shift shall receive a fifteen cent per hour shift premium.

FOOTNOTE - TREATMENT OPERATORS (Page Two)

* Treatment plant operators must have the license for the classification they hold. An operator may be classified in the next higher classification than the license held, but will be considered to be on probationary status. Probationary shall be defined as working toward the license for the classification held and shall not extend for a period longer than one year or the remaining minimum experience requirement for the license, whichever is greater. However, the Utilities Service Board may upon recommendation of the Director of Utilities, extend this probationary period in order to prevent inequities to present personnel as a result of this ordinance, provided said personnel are engaged in meaningful efforts to comply with the provisions of this ordinance.
