

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE No. 73-10

AN ORDINANCE SPECIALLY APPROPRIATING FROM THE SPECIAL FUNDS, EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED, OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, TO MEET THE EXTRAORDINARY EMERGENCIES FOUND TO EXIST IN THE VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS.

WHEREAS, certain extraordinary emergencies have developed since the adoption of the existing annual budget, so that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, to meet such extraordinary emergencies, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION I. That there be, and hereby is appropriated from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund of said City, not otherwise appropriated, to meet the extraordinary emergencies found to exist for the expenditure of more money for the current year of 1973 than was set out in detail in the budget as finally adopted and appropriations as finally made, the following sums:
