

## ORDINANCE NO. 72-42

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A JOINT BOARD  
OF PARKS AND RECREATION BETWEEN THE CITY  
OF BLOOMINGTON AND THE COUNTY OF MONROE

WHEREAS, The State of Indiana has by Statute enabled certain park districts to establish a joint Park and Recreation Board (Burns Indiana Statutes Annotated par.48-5856a, IC 19-7-4-45 and;

WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington and the County of Monroe are eligible to establish such a board under the terms of Burns par.48-5856b, IC 19-7-4-46, and;

WHEREAS, the respective Boards of Parks and Recreation of the City of Bloomington and the County of Monroe have expressed a desire to form a joint board as evidenced by their agreement of April 13, 1972;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington:

SECTION 1. Creation Title. There is hereby created a joint Board of Parks and Recreation between the City of Bloomington and the County of Monroe. Such board shall be entitled, "Board of Parks and Recreation of Bloomington and Monroe County".

SECTION 2. Facilities. All facilities and programs currently under the jurisdiction of the respective separate City and County Boards will be made available to all residents of Monroe County, subject to any regulations established by the joint Board.

SECTION 3. Personnel. All personnel employed by the Joint Board will be recruited, selected, trained, placed and supervised by the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation of Bloomington and Monroe County, subject to approval of the Joint Board.

SECTION 4. Finances. The Joint Board shall determine its total budget. The members from each participating political subdivision shall present to their appropriating body the total budget and set forth the amount chargeable to their political

subdivision as determined by the Joint Board. In case either appropriating body does not appropriate an amount sufficient to meet its proportionate share as determined by the Joint Board, then the other political subdivision may treat the reduced appropriation as repudiation of the agreement and terminate the relationship.

SECTION 5. Powers, Authorities, and Responsibilities

The Joint Board shall have all the powers and authorities now exercisable by the separate boards and shall assume all the duties and responsibilities now charged to the separate boards.

SECTION 6. Effective Date. Upon passage and promulgation by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington and after passage of a similar enacting ordinance by the Monroe County Council, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on January 1, 1973. If the Monroe County Council fails to pass an ordinance enacting the provisions of the informal agreement on May 3, 1972, within ninety (90) days of that date then this ordinance is void and of no effect.
