WHEREAS, Charles "Bud" Faris was unanimously selected by the Common Council of this City to be its first president after Bloomington attained second class status in 1966; and


WHEREAS, "Bud" was continuously retained in this role by the Council in 1967, 1968, and 1969; and




WHEREAS, "Bud" has, also, given outstanding public service in this community in many other significant ways through many years;






