

ORDINANCE NO. 67-46

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE BLOOMINGTON ZONING MAP, DATED JULY 18, 1950

WHEREAS, The Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, passed a zoning ordinance and adopted a zoning map on July 18, 1950, which said ordinance and map became effective on November 17, 1950, and

WHEREAS, said zoning ordinance and map are now incorporated in the "Municipal Code of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, 1957", as Chapter 30 of said code, and

WHEREAS, The City Plan Commission has recommended that said Bloomington Zoning Map be amended by the rezoning of certain property, now

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, UNDER AUTHORITY OF CHAPTER 174, OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the Map entitled "Bloomington Zoning Map", dated July 18, 1950, be amended to rezone the following described land in the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, from their present R-2 TWO FAMILY ZONE classification to an R-3 MULTIPLE DWELLING ZONE, to-wit:

Lots Numbered 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 in Young's Subdivision of Out Lot No. 27 to the City of Bloomington, and Lots Numbered 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 in Owens Addition to the City of Bloomington.

Lots are located on both sides of Grant Street between Ninth Street and Tenth Street.

SECTION 2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.


