ORDINANCE NO. 66-20

An Ordinance to amend Section 1 of Ordinance No. 65-34, entitled "An Ordinance establishing rates and charges for the use of and services rendered by the waterworks system of the City of Bloomington, and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith"

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Bloomington has heretofore on November 24, 1965, adopted Ordinance No. 65-34, establishing rates and charges for the use of and services rendered by the waterworks system of the City of Bloomington, such rates and charges to be subject to the approval of the Public Service Commission of Indiana; and

WHEREAS, a petition was filed with said Commission, a hearing thereafter held, and an order of said Commission issued under date of April 25, 1966, in Cause No. 30911, which order approved a schedule of rates and charges different than the schedule established by Ordinance No. 65-34; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council now finds that Ordinance No. 65-34 must be amended to conform the schedule of rates and charges for the use of and services rendered by the waterworks system of the City of Bloomington to the schedule of rates and charges approved by the Public Service Commission in its order dated April 25, 1966, in Cause No. 30911; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 65-34, adopted on

November 24, 1965, entitled "An Ordinance establishing rates and charges for the use of and services rendered by the waterworks system of the City of Bloomington, and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith," be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: Section 1. That there shall be and there are hereby established for the use of and service rendered by the waterworks system of the City of Bloomington, the following rates and charges:

Collection Charge

Except as herein otherwise provided, all bills shall be due and payable monthly and bills unpaid more than ten (10) days following the date of billing shall include a collection charge of ten per cent (10%) on the first \$3.00 of unpaid billing, and three per cent (3%) on the balance of unpaid billing in excess of \$3.00.

Reconnection Charge

An additional service charge of \$5.00 shall be collected for turning on any water service that has been shut off on account of non-payment of water bills.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and signing by the Mayor.
